

RECTOR'S NOTES

SERVICES IN MARCH

The penitential season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which is the 26th February. There will be a service at 7.30pm that evening in addition to our regular mid-week service at 10.30am.

For most of the six weeks of Lent, the liturgical colour will be purple, and this reflects that we are in a quieter, reflective period. There are a few exceptions to this, so—particularly the flower arrangers—please check the colours for particular Sundays to see what would be appropriate.

St Patrick's Day is the 17th March, but since it's a Tuesday we'll be celebrating the Apostle to the Irish on Sunday 15th March instead. The colour on this day is green. Our informal 10am service will be on this day in addition to our usual services.

It's Mothering Sunday on Sunday 22nd March. The colour is purple, but a splash of brighter colours wouldn't be frowned upon on such a family-focussed occasion.

On Wednesday 25th March, we will celebrate the Annunciation of our Lord, at the 10.30am service.

On Sunday 29th March, the sub-season of Passiontide begins, and the colours change to red for two weeks. After a shortened 11am service, our annual Easter Vestry meeting will be held. See below for more information about that.

EPISCOPAL APPOINTMENTS

In the last six months or so, quite a few bishops have retired, causing episcopal vacancies in Derry & Raphoe, Down & Dromore, Connor, and Armagh.

In our own diocese of Connor, an electoral college has been meeting over recent months, consisting of 51 members: three bishops, plus 12 clergy and 12 laity from our diocese, plus 12 clergy and 12 laity from other dioceses, and I am now delighted to announce that the Venerable George Davison, Archdeacon of Belfast and Rector of Carrickfergus has been appointed and will take up the position in the coming months. Please pray that George will



have God's strength and wisdom to lead us both closer to God and into the future.

The election of the new Archbishop of Armagh is a bit different. That decision is made by the bishops alone, with a decision expected on Friday 28th February.

PAROCHIAL GOVERNANCE

The two words in the English language must likely to cause a reader's eyes to glaze over are "Parochial Governance". It is, however, vitally important that parishioners understand how the local church is managed, and how you can play your part in this.

In February each year, the list of registered members of the parish is updated in what is called the Review Meeting. The list of members consists of those people who have (at any time in the past) signed a declaration of membership, and have made a recorded donation to parish funds in the previous year, and have (if they live outside the parish boundaries) worshipped in St Peter's at least once in the three months prior to the date of the Review Meeting. New names are added each year, and the names of those who have died or who no longer qualify are removed.

Anyone whose name appears on the updated list of registered members is entitled to attend a meeting called the General Vestry. As this meeting normally happens sometime around Easter, it is more usually referred to as the Easter Vestry. At this meeting, the Treasurer reports on parish finances, and appointments and elections are held for the forthcoming year. These always include two Churchwardens, two Glebewardens, and twelve further members of the Select Vestry. (The Select Vestry then appoints a Secretary, Treasurer and other officers). Additionally, every three years Diocesan Synodspersons and Parochial Nominators, and their supplementals, are elected at the Easter Vestry. Further information about these various roles will be distributed closer to the time, but do ask me about any of them sooner if you would like to get involved in the running of the parish.

The date of our Easter Vestry is Sunday 29th March. It will commence at 11.30am, immediately following a shortened act of worship at the normal time of 11am in the church. I encourage you to be there to help choose who will manage this parish for the next year, but I also implore you to consider putting your own name forward for election. If this church is to grow, then we always need new volunteers to take on these roles.

FINANCES

Many churches are struggling financially, and St Peter's is no different. Our expenditure still exceeds our income, and unfortunately we are eating into the savings that have been handed down to us from former generations. I am always reticent about preaching about money, but—given the circumstances—I feel that I will have to ask parishioners—much more vocally and emphatically—to consider how they support the Christian Church financially.

Such support can include bequeathing a contribution to the parish in your last will and testament. You'll need to contact your solicitor for assistance with this. This is something that each of us should consider doing sooner rather than later. As Jesus said, if we knew when the burglar was coming, we would make sure to lock up our house! Unfortunately, we can never tell what is around the corner for us, and so it is best to make plans for the future whilst we still have the time. The legal name of our parish is "The Parish of St Peter & St James, Belfast" and this should be explicitly stated in your will.

Please, let us be generous when it comes to assisting God's work, both during our regular offerings in our lifetime, but also through a legacy after our death.




Prayer Cards are available in church for you to fill in should you wish to have prayer for yourself or another person. These prayers will be offered at our mid-week service of Holy Communion.
